

PUBLIC NOTICE

TULE WIND PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

January 20, 2017

Information update for users of McCain Valley Road, Lark Canyon Campground, the Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) Area, and Cottonwood Campground. These notices will be posted periodically during construction of the Tule Wind Project.

CLOSURE AND DELAY INFORMATION

1. No closures of the campgrounds or OHV riding area are planned through January 29, 2017. Expect slow moving construction vehicles and equipment on McCain Valley Road Monday through Saturday from 7 AM until 5 PM. Security will be on site continuously.
2. McCain Valley Road will remain open throughout construction. Short delays will occur at times during the Project's construction. When work is expected to cause delays of more than 15 minutes on McCain Valley Road, an advisory will be posted at least 48 hours in advance on the Public Information Board at the entrance to the McCain Valley Recreation Area and at <http://tulewindecomp.com/>.
3. The campgrounds and OHV areas will remain open throughout construction and wind project operations except for occasional closures for public safety during blasting and large equipment operation near the OHV riding trails. Temporary closures of campground and OHV areas will be necessary beginning in late-January 2017, and these closures will be posted at least 48 hours in advance.

PLEASE NOTE

1. Drive with extra caution due to slow moving construction vehicles. Slow for personnel installing sediment and erosion control measures along the roadway.
2. Blasting is anticipated to be potentially required at all turbine locations and may be required in other locations identified during facility construction.
 - a. Prior to blasting, a siren and horn will provide an audible blast warning:
 - i. 5 minutes before the blast: 1 minute slowly rising and falling siren
 - ii. 1 minute before blast: 1 minute rapidly rising and falling siren
 - iii. After the blast: 1 minute continuous horn
 - b. When you hear the siren please move away from the designated blasting area. When the area is clear of hazards, the construction contractor will allow normal traffic in the area resume.
