List of Topics to be presented by Tule Wind LLC Environmental Monitors during the Environmental Awareness Tailgate Meetings:

Key Rules to Follow at all Times

- Limit all activities to designated approved work areas
- Do not access an area in absence of obtaining approval from the environmental monitor
- Do not litter or leave trash exposed
- Clean up and report all spills and hazardous materials
- Practice fire protection and safety
- Be aware of applicable environmental requirements
- Reduce speeds along unpaved access roads to minimize dust generation

Biological Resources

- How to protect wildlife and protect yourself
- Special status species that may be encountered onsite
- What to do if a special status species is observed onsite
- Notification procedure
- Avoid disturbance of standing water to ensure wildlife can continue to utilize the water source
- Minimize disturbance of nesting birds that are flagged by the environmental monitors

Cultural Resources

- Do not disturb archaeological or paleontological resources
- Report new discoveries or bones suspected to be human remains to the environmental monitor.
- Provide overview of archeological sensitivity in the project area and fact that Native American monitors will be present onsite.
- Maintain a professional working environment in the presence of Native American representatives at all times.
